The new team has learnt a lot from Ron, seen in him a dedication to the people of Vanuatu and caught his "heart for God's mission" there. Ron had so much confidence in the Unite team that he told us "we could go to Vanuatu without him". That we did and we were welcomed by the Ni-Vanuatu people just like Ron is.

The team met The General Secretary of Churches of Christ Vanuatu, Richardson Toka last year and got to know him and Ps Lewis Wari, the development officer. Richardson has kept in contact with us and sent a report of a visit to Tanna that they made in February. He comments below about their visit to Imarap. This is a one of the new church plants visited by the Unite Team last year.

Mr. Willie is very keen to develop the new area, he even witness to their Chief and the chief accepted the churches development and encourage the people in Imarap to attend whatever the Church is organizing.
